MATERIALS LIST for Copperplate and Pointed Pen workshop

- Pointed nibs*
- Dip nib pen holder
- Medium Water-based ink or gouache in black or a dark colour (Sumi is good)
- A thin, smooth, not expensive paper that works well with your chosen medium, i.e. it doesn't bleed (A4 or A3, whichever you have/prefer)**
- Cheap, small brush for filling your nib
- Small container or dish for your ink or gouache
- Water pot
- An old cotton rag, for wiping your nib/cleaning spills
- Ruler
- Pencil (mechanical or ordinary HB pencil and sharpener)
- Sloped board, if you use one

OPTIONAL EXTRAS (only if you have them handy, don't buy specially)

- Compass
- A Water based metallic eg Finetec
- A white gouache/ink eg Dr Marten's Bleedproof white, Pen White
- Magnifying glass or jewellery loupe
- * Bring any favourites that you have. Ones I have used and like include:

Gillott 404, E.F. Principal, Brause EF 66, Brause Blue Pumpkin, Hunt 101, Nikko G, Speedball C6. Gillott 303 and Brause 513 are also lovely, good for very fine, small work, but they need a feather light touch.

Right-handers might prefer an elbow nib or a Moblique pen holder (a 2-in-1 nib holder that can be used at either a straight or oblique angle). If you're left-handed, as I am, you don't need an oblique angle. Copperplate is one of the few hands that is easier for a left-handed scribe!
